GENERAL INFORMATION

The ACT takes approximately three hours and thirty minutes to complete, including breaks (or just over 4 hours if you are taking the Writing Test).

Most scores are available for online viewing within two weeks of each test date.

Score reports are normally released within three to eight weeks of each test date (or within five to eight weeks if you took the ACT Writing Test).

RECENT CHANGES

As of September 2018, ACT will administer an unscored experimental section to all students who take the ACT with standard timing. This 20-minute section will follow the Science Test and precede the Writing Test.
