The LSAT consists of five multiple choice sections, which appear in any order, and ends with a Writing Sample:

- **Arguments** (24–26 graded multiple choice questions)
- **Arguments** (24–26 graded multiple choice questions)
- **Reading Comprehension** (26–28 graded multiple choice questions)
- **Logic Games** (22–24 graded multiple choice questions)
- **Experimental** (22–28 ungraded multiple choice questions)
- **Writing Sample** (1 ungraded essay)\*

\* Starting with the June 2019 LSAT administration, the writing section of the LSAT will no longer be administered with the multiple choice sections. Instead, students will be able to complete the writing sample on a secure online platform “at a time and place of their choosing.”
