RECENT CHANGES

LSAC has announced that they will continue to offer a remotely proctored version of the LSAT through June 2022. LSAC may also provide an option to take the LSAT at test centers once they can safely do so.

Starting in August 2021, LSAC will add an unscored, unidentified experimental section along with the three scored sections. The LSAT will continue to have three scored sections and one experimental section for at least the next two to three years.

Starting August 2020, *first-time* test takers will have the option to preview their scores before deciding whether to keep them.

As of June 2019, the writing section of the LSAT will no longer be administered with the multiple choice sections. Instead, students will be able to complete the writing sample on a secure online platform “at a time and place of their choosing.” The LSAT Writing sample must be completed before LSAC will release scores.

CANCELLATIONS

If you need to cancel your scores after consulting with your tutor, cancellation requests must be submitted online by 11:59 p.m. (ET) the sixth day after your LSAT. Your score report *will* indicate that you canceled your score.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Students must register for the LSAT before requesting accommodations. The application required for accommodated testing (including all documentation) is due by the registration deadline, but LSAC strongly encourages students to have all information submitted earlier.

If you wish to take the LSAT again or transfer your registration to another date, you must submit another written request for accommodations by the deadline associated with your registration for an administration of the LSAT.
