* At the July 2019 test date, some students will be assigned paper testing, while others will be assigned digital testing. For this transitional test date only, all July test takers will have the option to see their scores before deciding to cancel, and they will be able to retake the test through April 2020 without charge if they choose to cancel their July scores.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The LSAT takes just under four hours to complete, including breaks.

RECENT CHANGES

The LSAT will be administered as a digital test on tablets starting in July 2019, with a full transition to digital-only in September 2019.

Starting with the June 2019 LSAT administration, the writing section of the LSAT will no longer be administered with the multiple choice sections. Instead, students will be able to complete the writing sample on a secure online platform “at a time and place of their choosing.”

Starting with the February 2018 LSAT, there will no longer be a late registration period.

Starting with the June 2018 LSAT, students can cancel scores online only; scores can no longer be canceled on the answer sheet at the test center.

CANCELLATIONS

If you need to cancel your scores after consulting with your tutor, cancellation requests must be submitted online by 11:59 p.m. (ET) the sixth day after your LSAT. Your score report *will* indicate that you canceled your score.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Students must register for the LSAT before requesting accommodations. The application required for accommodated testing (including all documentation) is due by the registration deadline, but LSAC strongly encourages students to have all information submitted earlier.

If you wish to take the LSAT again or transfer your registration to another date, you must submit another written request for accommodations by the deadline associated with your registration for an administration of the LSAT.
